Garden of Divine Mercy

Trust in Jesus. Sit and pray by the beautifully tiled Divine Mercy painting on marble. Stone benches allow for long meditation on the Lord's Sorrowful Passion as you pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Also viewable from your car.

Mary's Grotto
